



PLASTER Face mask TUTORIAL

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Supplies Needed:

Plaster of Paris
Water
Vaseline
Scissors
Gauze
Casserole Dish

Purchase Notes:

Paint section of Home Depot

Baby aisle--Make sure you have PLENTY

Any First Aid aisle

Disposable and at least 3" deep

Lubricate. Cut. Mix. Dip. Drape.

Generously apply vaseline to the entire face and surrounding hairline. When you think you have enough on, add more vaseline and repeat. You don't want stuck eyelashes!! Cut most of your gauze strips about 1" wide and 4" long and a few slightly smaller to fill in awkward curves around the nose and eyes. Mix your plaster of paris with water to make a thick paste, about the consistency of yogurt. Dip your strips into plaster mixture and drape gingerly over your subject, being mindful not to cover up the nose.



Dry. Remove. Refine. Display.

When the plaster makes a hard hollow sound when tapped, the plaster is dry and ready to remove. Carefully remove the mask making sure to keep all eyebrows and eyelashes intact. Trim excess. Sand. Display on a shelf for all of the world.

- For a positive, tape over the nose area, lubricate with Vaseline, mix plaster slightly thicker than yogurt consistency and carefully spoon into the mold. Dry. Sand. Display.



*Use discretion when attempting this tutorial. FYI: Plaster dissolves in water. **DO NOT COVER NOSE. DO NOT ATTEMPT WITHOUT VASELINE. DO NOT INGEST PLASTER.**
