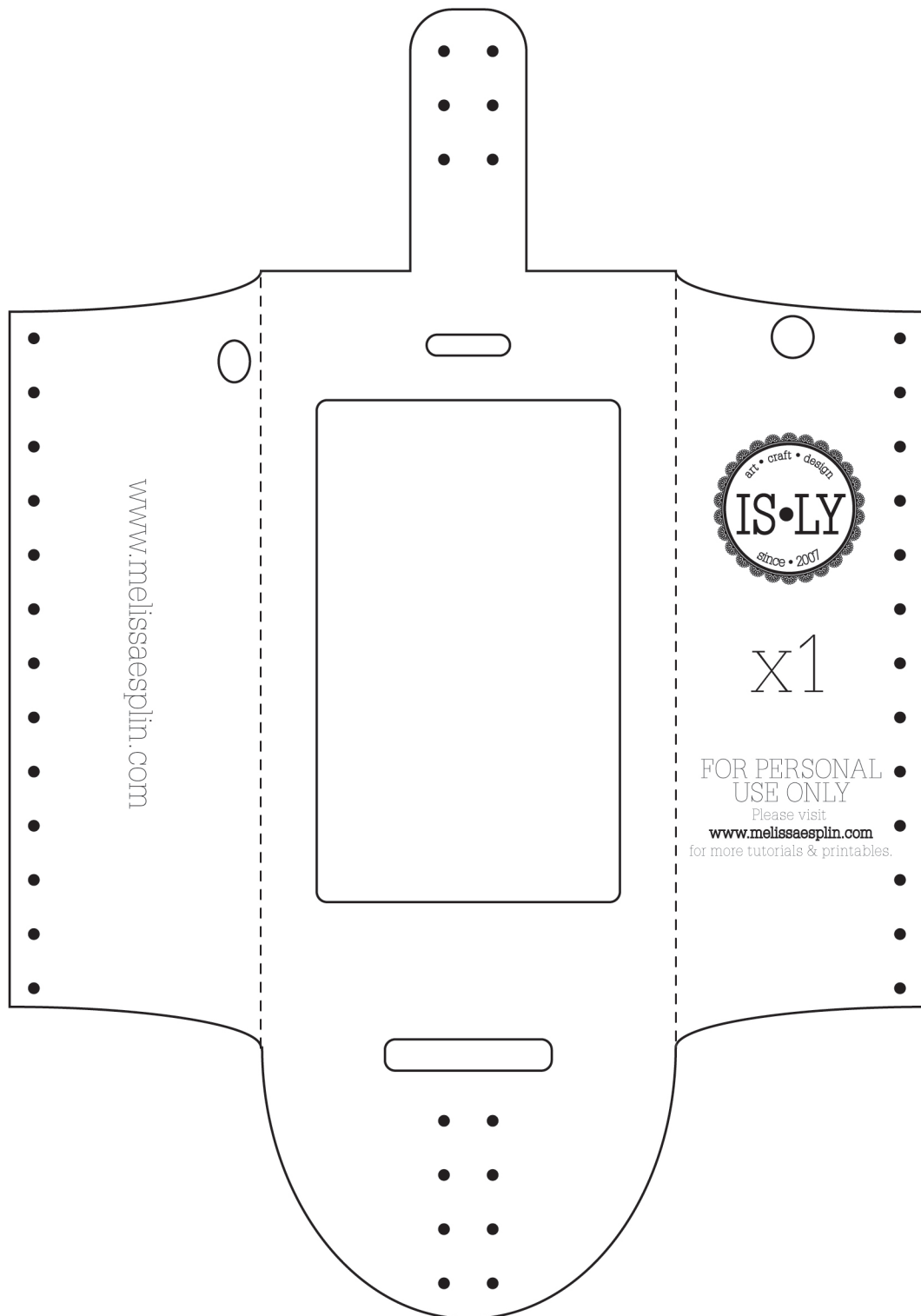


# iPhone Case 2.0 Pattern





# iPhone Case 2.0

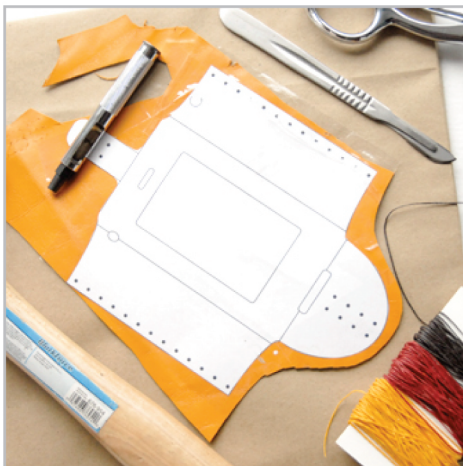
## Materials

for this project, you'll need the following:

- 8.5x11 inches of 1.5-2 oz. leather
- Hammer
- X-Acto knife
- Scissors
- Pattern
- iPhone
- Leather punch or awl
- Waxed linen thread or sinew
- Curved needle
- Clear packing tape



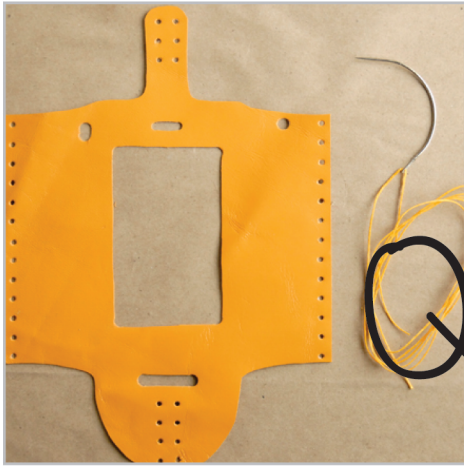
## Directions



Smooth out the leather on a self-healing mat. Lay the pattern piece on the leather, tape into place using clear packing tape.



Using your hole punch, punch out each hole and the corners of each box. With your X-acto knife, cut the remaining parts out very carefully.



Remove the tape and smooth out any rough edges from cutting. Thread your curved needle with unwaxed linen thread.



Assemble the sides and the bottom, lining up the holes. Leave a 2-3 inch tail at the bottom on the outside and sew up the back.

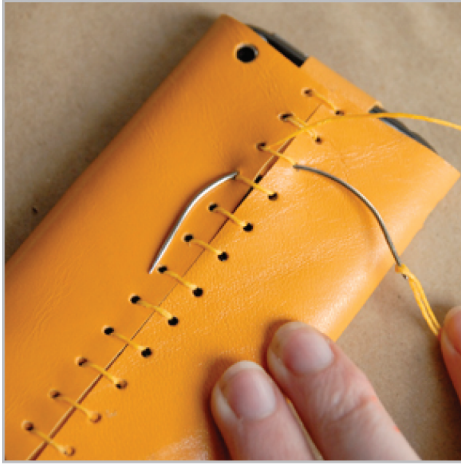
*between steps be sure to lightly score along dotted lines w/ an X-acto. SCORE! Do NOT cut through leather!*



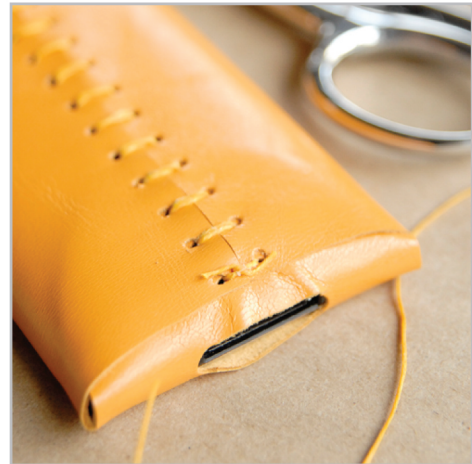
Once you get to this point, about 3-4 holes from the top, insert your iPhone. From here you're going to sew your phone into the case.



Insert the top tab underneath the two side flaps and line up the holes. Sew all the way to the top and double back to where you started.



Double back to where you started. It's crucial that you have a curved needle for this part!



Once you're back to where you started, tie a square knot and trim the ends.



Enjoy!

See these edges?

If you score lines (as indicated on the pattern) you'll avoid the puckering. If you forgot this step, no worries! the leather will start to lay flat after about a week.
